Tea Time now on after Meeting

If we want to continue to have a COVID-safe tea time, we need to continue to do the following:

Self-service is not allowed,

SO,

We will have one server in the kitchen, serving coffee and tea in cups retrieved from the dishwasher earlier in the morning. The

water is to be drawn directly from the urn. Two people may work on this, one at the urn, one at the serving window, if they are from the same household. All kitchen and dining things and consumables are to be kept in the kitchen. Sugar and milk in the carton should be nearby on the serving counter.

Bring **bought bikkies only**, no cakes or homemade things yet. Cakes are out because they are harder to handle. Commercially packaged hors d'oeuvres size items only, at this stage.

One person serving hors d'oeuvres from a tray, circulating from Boa Vista through the foyer to assure that no-one goes without. Folks mainly sit around the edge of the Boa Vista room (and the foyer, if numbers compel).

Seating is 1.5 metres apart. Best to crack the Boa Vista door and the Meeting House door, to assure air flow.

Clean-up involves

- * putting all crockery and cutlery in the dishwasher, and starting it,
- * cleaning the service window area and other touch points
- * and hygienically disposing of all disposables: teabags, tissues, paper towels and other materials etc.
- * All touch points in the kitchen should be wiped down with a soapy disposable 'cloth'.
