Yearly Meeting receives and accepts a Statement from Quaker Peace and Legislation Committee (QPLC) which expresses concern at trends in Australia's defence policies which now incorporate the Australia, United Kingdom, and United States (AUKUS) agreement.

We encourage Friends to take appropriate action on the basis of this Statement.
