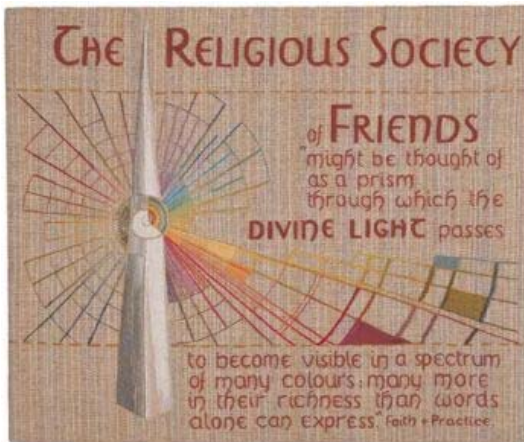


Australian Quaker Tapestry

The Quaker Tapestry is a celebration of 350 years of Quaker insights and experiences embroidered in narrative crewel work on specially woven wool cloth.

The Quaker Tapestry is quite unlike any other contemporary embroidery in its style, scope, content, method of execution and consequent effect on many of those who took part. The vision and enthusiasm springs from the grass roots. The Quaker Tapestry uses a new embroidery style and technique which enables both skilled and unskilled workers to cooperate.

Getting Ready for the Tapestry Workshops

During the workshops you will be treated to demonstrations, practical sessions and information about the Exhibition. In the course of the day you will hear stories and anecdotes of the Tapestry and the people involved.

The workshops can accommodate equally the experienced embroiderer and those who have had very little embroidery experience. Bridget Guest has helped many people learn the narrative crewel embroidery incorporating the unique 'Quaker Stitch' which was specially designed for the Quaker Tapestry by Anne Wynn-Wilson.
